




They could hear Shere Khan getting closer and closer. Father Wolf rushed out of the cave to defend his home.

"So, you have the man-cub!" he growled. "Give him to me, he's mine!"


"No!" said Father Wolf. "We only take orders from the Leader of our Pack! We want to keep him. But if we want to kill him, we will kill him!"

Then he turned and limped off into the jungle.



He was the only other animal allowed to attend the meetings.


"I do, I speak for the little man-cub," he said. "He's harmless. Let him run with the Pack. I will teach him the Law of the Jungle!"


"Will anyone else speak for the man-cub?"
