Dialogue 1 Visiting a Warehouse

- (A is Lin Jun, a warehouse keeper, who is introducing the warehouse to B, a visitor.)
- A: Welcome to our warehouse. I'm Lin Jun, the warehouse keeper and I'm responsible for the management of goods.
- B: Glad to meet you, Mr. Lin. Could you briefly introduce the types of your warehouse?
- A: Yes. Our warehouse is divided into private warehouse, public warehouse and contract warehouse.
- B: What is private warehouse?
- A: It is a storage facility owned by the firm whose goods are stored in it.
- B: I see. Public warehouse must be a storage facility offering its services to all firms and persons.
- A: Yes, it is.
- B: What about contract warehouse?
- A: Contract warehouse is a storage facility that provides unique and special warehousing and logistics services for one customer.
- B: Thank you for your introduction.

Dialogue 2 Talking about the Goods in a Warehouse

- (A is Daniel, a manager in a logistics company, who is talking with B, Kenny, a warehouse keeper.)
- A: Kenny, how come these few cartons of goods without any label?
- B: Let me see... These goods are just unloaded from a container.
- A: You should have labeled them before carrying them into storage. In case the workers have mixed them with the goods from other customers.
- B: Yes, I'll pay attention to it.
- A: Who do they belong to?
- B: If I'm not mistaken, they belong to Mr. Smith from Beijing Enterprise Co., Ltd.

- B: Nice to meet you. I'm Wang Lin. Could you briefly introduce the procedures after the goods arrive at the warehouse?
- A: Sure. First indoor operation, then warehouse management, and finally warehouse operation.
- B: What is indoor operation?
- A: They are a series of procedures including arranging storehouses, checking the goods, enrolling the goods accurately, loading and depositing them in standard.
- B: What about the warehouse management?
- A: We need to check the products and facilities regularly, keep the warehouse clean and safe, standardize each operation and gather the information.
- B: And what's the warehouse operation?
- A: It consists of five aspects: the warehouse procedures, the quantity of the goods, loading the goods and depositing them in standard, providing the goods according to the shipment list, saving and filing the bills of document.

Warehousing and Warehouse Functions

Warehousing is the storage of goods for profit. The physical location, the warehouse, is a storage facility that receives goods and products for the eventual distribution to consumers or other businesses. Warehouse management is the process of coordinating the incoming goods, the subsequent storage and tracking of the goods, and finally, the distribution of the goods to their proper destinations.

Warehousing is a key component of the overall business supply chain. The supply chain consists of the facilities and distribution options for the procurement of materials from manufacturer to customer and all points in between. It includes the production of materials into components and finished products and then the distribution to customers.

Warehousing companies are now striving to become more than simply storage facilities. They are transforming themselves into "third-party logistics providers" or "3PLs" that provide a wide array of services and functions. In addition to packing and staging pallets, contemporary warehousing facilities offer light manufacturing, call centers, labeling, and other non-storage options.

Warehouse functions include:

- the storage of goods to permit managing product to flow or to accommodate longer production runs;
- serving as a mixing point where products from different suppliers are mixed and then distributed to fulfill customers' orders;
- a sales branch and customer service location;
- a source of supplies for production;
- a staging area for final packaging or finishing.
