Jacob Tremblay is a Canadian actor. He made his film debut as *Blue* in the live action animated film *The Smurfs 2* (2013). His breakout performance was in the dark drama *Room*

(2015), for which he received critical acclaim. In 2016, Tremblay played a supporting role in the comedy film *Donald Trump's the Art of the Deal: The Movie*, and in 2017, he co-starred with Jaeden Martell, playing brothers, in the drama *The Book of Henry*, with Naomi Watts as their mother.

He has also starred as children in jeopardy in the horror films *Before I Wake* (2016), *Shut In* (2016), and the bigger-budget *The Predator* (2018), played in the drama *Burn Your Maps* (2016) with Vera



Farmiga, and headlined the blockbuster novel adaptation Wonder (2017), as Auggie Pullman.

II. Movie Story

Based on the *New York Times* best-seller, *Wonder* tells the incredibly inspiring and heartwarming story of August Pullman. Born with facial differences that, up until now, Auggie has been home-schooled, but as he approaches fifth grade, his parents decide to enroll him in Beecher Prep, a private school. Before the school year begins, Auggie meets with Mr. Tushman, the principal, who arranges a tour for him with three other students: Jack Will, Julian Albans, and Charlotte Cody. When school starts, Auggie is initially ostracized by nearly the entire student body, but soon forms a close friendship with Jack. The situation comes to a head-on Halloween when Auggie, disguised in a costume, overhears Jack joining in with the bullying. As Auggie isolates himself from his classmates and family, his sister Olivia's frustration grows, fueled by years of feeling ignored by her family.

Returning to school, Auggie ignores Jack but admits to Summer that he had overheard the incident. Jack feels ashamed for his actions, and punches Julian in the mouth and he gets suspended from school. Jack writes a letter apologizing to Mr. Tushman for his actions, and Mr. Tushman, understanding Jack was defending his friend, suspends him for two days rather than expelling him. Jack later apologizes to Auggie and they reconcile. At the

nature retreat, Auggie and Jack are threatened by a trio of seventh graders from another school, but Julian's friends come to their defense. Auggie then becomes more accepted by his classmates. At the year-end graduation ceremony, Auggie is given the Henry Ward Beecher Medal for standing out among his classmates and receives a standing ovation. The movie ends with everyone applauding Auggie, and Isabel commenting on him being a "wonder".

VI. Culture Reflection

Star Wars (released in 1977), also known as *Star Wars: Episode IV*—*A New Hope*, is one of the original trilogy directed by George Lucas among the *Star Wars* series. The movie tells about the adventurous journey of a simple farm boy—Luke Skywalker into a Jedi Knight, as he and his newly met allies (Han Solo, Chewbacca, Obi-wan Kenobi, C-3PO, R2-D2) attempt to rescue a rebel leader, Princess Leia, from the clutches of the Empire. The conclusion is culminated as the rebels,



including Skywalker and flying ace Wedge Antilles make an attack on the Empire's most powerful and ominous weapon, the Death Star.



Padawan, a fictional character in *Star Wars*, also known as a Padawan learner, Padawan apprentice, Jedi apprentice, or apprentice, is the stage of Jedi training where a Force-sensitive of the Jedi Order trained under a Jedi Knight or Master. A Padawan's master is meant to choose their apprentice, although, during the galactic Clone Wars,

the Jedi High Council begins to assign Padawans. In order to become a Knight, the Jedi in training need to complete their time as a Padawan and the Trials.

Boba Fett, a fictional character in *Star Wars*, is a clone of Jango Fett, the human male bounty hunter whose genetic code spawned an army of clone troopers during the final years of the Galactic Republic. With his customized Mandalorian armor, deadly weaponry, and the fearsome



slave as his starship, Boba carries on his father's legacy by becoming one of the most feared bounty hunters in the galaxy during the reign of the Galactic Empire. Trained in combat martial skills from a young age, he becomes a legend over the course of his career, which includes contracts for the Empire and the criminal underworld.

Darth Sidious, a fictional character in *Star Wars*, born Sheev Palpatine and also known simply as the Emperor, is a human male Dark Lord of the Sith and Emperor of the Galactic Empire, ruling from 19 BBY to 4 ABY. Rising to power in the Republic



Senate as the senator of Naboo, the secretive Sith Lord cultivates two identities, Sidious and Palpatine, using both to further his political career. He orchestrates the fall of the Galactic Republic and the Jedi Order through the Clone Wars, and then establishes his reign over the galaxy which lasts until his death at the Battle of Endor. However, the

dark side of the Force gives rise to powers which allow the Emperor to return from the grave.

Chewbacca, known affectionately to his friends as Chewie, is a fictional character in the *Star Wars* franchise. He is a Wookiee male warrior, a tall, hirsute, bipedal, intelligent species originating from the fictional planet of Kashyyyk. He fights in the Clone Wars, the Galactic Civil War, and the "Cold War" and subsequent First Order/Resistance War. Chewbacca is the loyal friend and first mate of Han Solo, and serves as co-pilot on Solo's spaceship, the Millennium Falcon; together



they help the Rebel Alliance defeat the Galactic Empire and restore freedom to the galaxy.



Minecraft is a puzzle-adventure game in which players mine pixelated landscapes to harvest stylized cube-like materials. From a first-person perspective, players traverse an "open-world" environment, avoid hazards, build new structures, and craft weapons (e.g. swords, axes, bows) to occasionally defend against

monsters (e.g. zombies, skeletons, spiders). Though not encouraged, players can engage in violent acts, such as lighting animals on fire and harming animals with weapons. Mild explosions are occasionally heard as players use dynamite to fend off creatures and mine the environment.

Our Town is a 1938 meta-theatrical three-act play by the American playwright Thornton Wilder which won the Pulitzer Prize for Drama. The play tells the story of the fictional American small town of Grover's Corners between 1901 and 1913 through the everyday lives of its citizens. Throughout, Wilder uses meta-theatrical devices, setting the play in
